INFORMATIONAL LETTERS (sample letters in General Guidelines)

- > Send to principal, activities director and coaches of each Region V school.
- Letter #1: Should be sent out one month prior to the tournament date. This letter should include bracket information, game times and other information deemed pertinent by the tournament director.
- > Letter #2: Should be sent out 2-3 weeks prior to the tournament date.

PARTICIPANTS

- > All member schools of Region V may compete.
- > Mix six and 2A teams must attend the seeding tournaments.

COACHES MEETING

- > Should be held once all coaches have arrived and prior to the start of the tournament.
- > The game schedule and skills competition will be reviewed.
- All conference nomination and selection will be completed. (see Region V All-conference selection procedure)
- Coaches should review for accuracy the Good Sport award and sign All-academic certificates.

OFFICIALS

- Each school will be given the opportunity to select from a list of certified volleyball officials, sent out by the Region V secretary prior to the tournament. (see Region V official Selection Criteria)
- > The tournament director will select a head official from those who have been selected. The tournament director and the head official will create a rotation to be used throughout the tournament.
- > The rotation may be changed for the championship match to prevent any hometown official working his/her team in the championship match whenever possible.
- There will also be an official scorer, timer and libero tracker as well as 2 adult line judges assigned to officiate each match.

EQUIPMENT

- Score board and clock
- Official score book
- Libero tracking sheets
- Line-up sheets
- > 3 game quality volleyballs NFHS certified
- Line judges flags may be used.

SKILLS COMPETITION

The tournament director and coaches will run a passing and serving competition, usually in the morning of the final day of the tournament.

- > 1A/2A holds 2 separate competitions (see Skill Competition diagram & scoring sheet).
- > 3A/4A combines both skills into 1 competition (see diagram). The winner of the competitions will be recognized at the awards ceremony.

RESULTS

> Report state qualifiers to ASAA by Sunday morning.

AWARDS

- Individual Awards
 - All-academic certificates-seniors with a G.P.A. equal to or exceeding 3.0
 - Great-sport patches 2 players from each team nominated by the coach
 - All-conference medals Number will be equal to 2 times the number of competing schools up to a maximum of 12.
- ➢ Team Awards
 - Sportsmanship Award selected by a committee usually made up of the officials and the tournament director. (see Region V sportsmanship award criteria)
 - Runner up Award Mix six, and 2A
 - Championship Award & 14 First place medals Mix six, 2A, 3A, and 4A
